Subject: Submittal of FY 2006-2007 Annual Report

Dear Mr. Wolfe:

I am pleased to submit the Annual Report for implementation of the Santa Clara Valley Urban Runoff Pollution Prevention Program's (SCVURPPP's) Urban Runoff Management Plan (URMP) during fiscal year 2006-2007. Submittal of this Annual Report fulfills Provision C.6 of NPDES Permit No. CAS029718 (Order 01-024 as amended). The report provides documentation of the SCVURPPP's and the Co-permittees' activities; evaluation of the effectiveness of these activities; and measures for continuous improvement toward achieving the SCVURPPP goals.

Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Report describe activities conducted by the SCVURPPP on behalf of the Co-permittees, in the areas of program management, permit management and continuous improvement. Section 3 contains information on the Program's local and regional public information/participation program including the Watershed & Outreach efforts coordinated with the Santa Clara Basin Watershed Management Initiative (SCBWMI). Section 4 contains information on the Program's two pronged monitoring approach covering: environmental monitoring and assessment, and programmatic monitoring for FY-06-07. Section 5 covers the Program's watershed management measures including the work that Program and Co-permittees have conducted to both support the SCBWMI and integrate both efforts. Section 6 covers the Program's pesticide management activities to comply with Provision C.9.d. and Section 7 contains a report of the Program's Mercury Pollution Prevention Activities conducted during FY 06-07 per Provision C.9.c

Section 8 describes the Program's efforts during FY 06-07 to assist Co-permittees in addressing and controlling development and re-development as it relates to stormwater quality and flow through the development project planning, review and approval process, per Provision C.3. Section 9 contains the Co-permittees' IND and IC/ID Summary Tables for FY 06-07. Co-permittee summary tables are also included in each Co-permittee Annual Report and contain similar information to what is found within Section 9 of the Program's *FY 05-06 Annual Report*.

Section 10 (bound in two separate volumes) contains the Co-permittees' FY 06-07 Annual Reports, prepared in accordance with the Water Board staff document entitled *Suggested SCVURPPP Co-permittee Annual Report Format* (Draft) dated May 29, 2003. Each Co-permittee Annual Report includes a cover letter summarizing local program highlights, accomplishments and continuous improvement items; and a certification statement.

In FY 06-07, the Program and Co-permittees received three national awards in recognition of their excellent stormwater management programs and efforts. They include the following: USEPA 2006 Clean Water Act Recognition Award for Stormwater Management (Municipal); National Association of Environmental Professionals (NAEP) National Environmental Excellence Award for Education Excellence; and the FY 05-06 National Association of Flood and Stormwater Management Agencies (NAFSMA), Excellence in Communication Award, Third Place, for Improving Water Quality.

In October 2006, the Program sponsored an awards program for exemplary site designs to protect water quality. This awards program recognizes Santa Clara Valley's public agency and private development community leaders who are solving site design challenges, reducing stormwater pollution and runoff quantity, and meeting the requirements of the NPDES permit. The 2006 award winners included:

- Exemplary Public Project (Large Site) – Tully Library, City of San Jose;
- Exemplary Public Project (Small Site) – Alum Rock Library, City of San Jose;
- Exemplary Private Project (Residential) – Willow Glen Reflections, DKB Homes and City of San Jose;
- Exemplary Private Project (Institutional) – Congregation Sinai Facility, Congregation Sinai and City of San Jose.
